Furling for Tandem Hooks

Last year I had a person talk to me concerning a Fergus Moal fly. I had never tied anything quite like this before. We have had some exposure to furling for leaders, Ken Handley Damselfly, and two of the flies for the Fly Dope. I have a few pictures showing an easy way to add a tandem hook to those good flies that get short strikes and you don't get a hookup. First you need the desired trailing hook. Next cut about eight inches of Dacron line. Now attach the line to the hook.



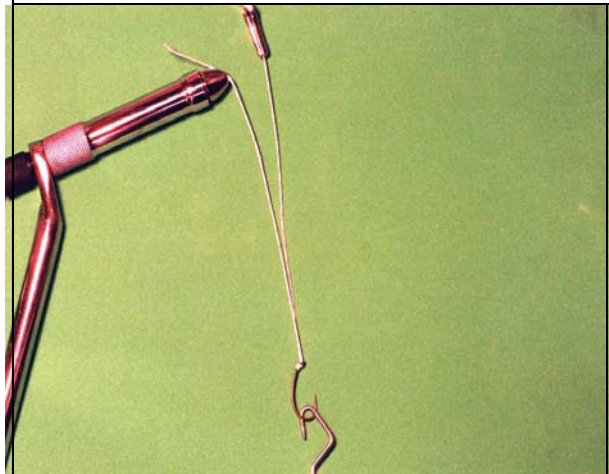
Attach one end of the Dacron to your fly tying vice and the other end to hackle pliers.



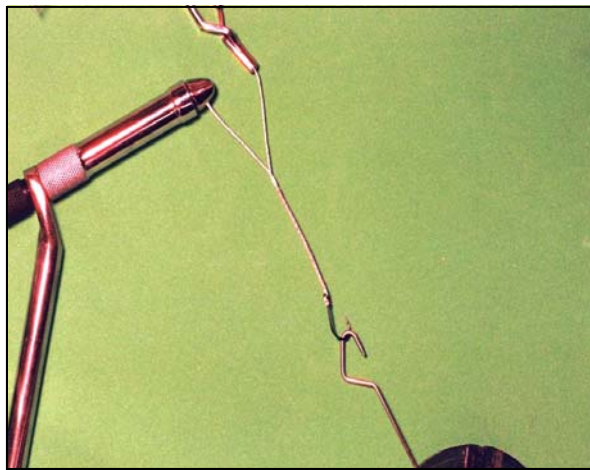

Twist in a counter clockwise direction until you see the Dacron line tightening up. Holding the line taunt, grasp the hook with a Sheppard's hook or the like. Carefully fold the line at the hook and allow the hook to twist. You can help by turning the hook in a clockwise direction. It won't look exactly like the next picture, but you get the idea.



This next one will be more correct.



After completing the steps, you will end up with the next picture. I coat the furled line with Sally Hansen Teflon Nail Polish. Attach to the front hook and build your fly.

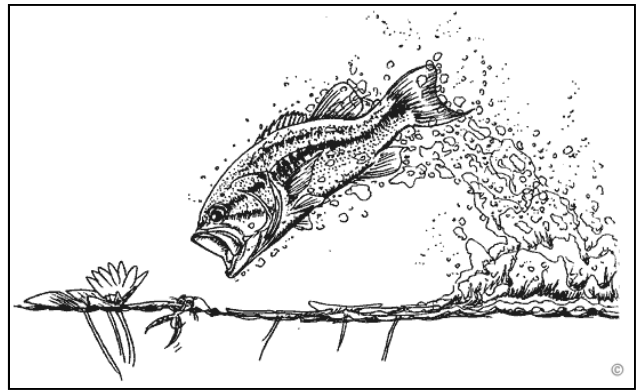
Outings

Thanks to everyone that attended our February outing on the lower Kings River. I think we had about 30 people come by at some time during the day. The river was crowded but fish were still caught. Phil Davis landed 4 fish and Ron Richards landed a big one (maybe 8 lbs.). The weather was great and we got to eat, visit, and fish. It was good to see old members and new members getting together. Thanks to Scott West and Bob Papazian for their help. And Sue Leveque made some really good brownies. If you weren't able to make it, hopefully you can make one of our future outings.

Our Pyramid Lake trip (north of Reno) is scheduled for March 31- April 2 (2 nights). Pyramid Lake is on a Paiute Indian reservation. It is a huge lake that contains different types of fish but is known for its very large Lahontan Cutthroat trout. Some people wade out to get close to the drop-offs and fish from there. But many people use a step ladder to make casting easier. A stripping basket helps. Because strong winds are known to come up suddenly at Pyramid, light rods are not commonly used. Seven to 9 weight rods with shooting head lines are recommended. To help prevent your back cast from slapping the water a 9 to 10 foot rod is beneficial. Although different techniques are used, the most proven technique for hooking these cutthroat trout is to fish near the bottom. Many people use a sink tip or fast sinking shooting head line. See Jerry Hopewell's fly tying article for some of the most popular flies to use. You will want to make sure you bring some warm clothes. The conditions can be very cold there. A special fishing license is needed to fish on the Paiute reservation. The daily rate is \$9. But hooking up one of those big trout makes it worth the money. Lodging on the reservation is limited. Crosby Lodge has trailers and cabins (755) 476-0400. Some people stay in Reno and drive in each day. A couple of possibilities are the Sands Regency (866) 386-7829 or the Grand Sierra (800) 501-2651. I hope you can join us at Pyramid. If you are planning on going please let me know.

With the interest that was shown at our last general meeting in Rod Building classes I would like to make the offer to the club members that were not able to make it to the last club meeting. I am starting to plan for rod building classes starting sometime in May anyone that would like to be added to my E-mailing list and has a interest in learning to wrap there own fly rod or would just like the information on what is needed to build there own fly rod please E-mail me back and I will put your name on the Rod Building information E-mail list. If any of you already know how to wrap rods you may even learn a few choice things maybe in the way of finishing that's always a problem point of rod building put your name on the list. I may set up a rod finishing class just for those people.

When you E-mail me back please in the subject line put **ROD BUILDING** that way I can add you to my list. In your E-mail add your name, phone number, briefly explain what you would like to learn like: choosing part, building handles, wrapping guides , finishing or building a rod from start to finish.

In Rod Building there is a investment of time and small investment of money needed for your tools and a wrapping bench and tensioner but you can turn out a fly rod as good as any brand name rod out there at a fraction of the cost. you can recuperate your investment on your very first rod. The bench can be home made with ease anything from a cardboard box to wood V-blocks with wheels or felt. I can help with the set up and design of that also. The club has a very few older wrapping devices and there are easily made and better benches/devices as far as dryer for finishing I have room for 4 rods on my commercial dryer so the finishing classes should be no larger then 4 people

First E-mailing will be what is needed in the way of supplies and tools.

Second E-mailing will cover what is need in the way of parts: Blank, Guides, Reelseat, Cork, and we will do some talking about what you want to use the rod for and what Guides and handle would be best for you and a few places to get these supplies.

Third E-mailing will be for sign ups and the times and dates. The best way to do that is once you have all the parts and supplies you

E-mail me and once I get a few people I will set up classes. I would like to keep the classes small but there will be as many classes as there is interest until everyone that wants to learn is done

I do have a lot of good information and that list of information is always growing so in that department your input is always welcome. I look forward to working with all of you and your input is always needed and welcome.

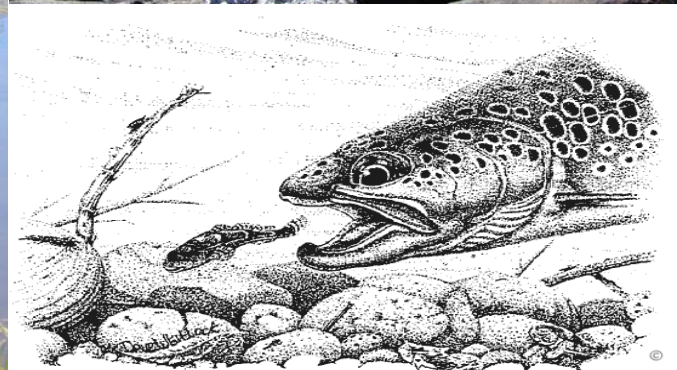

Since 1999, the Kings River Fisheries Management Program (Program) has been working to restore the lower Kings River to the fishery it used to be. Not only can you read these documents, you can report your success, or lack, on the lower Kings via the Anglers' survey, get the latest reservoir levels, be a part of the ongoing discussions in the forum section and view some pictures of the latest restoration efforts on the lower Kings.

I am trying to set up a two day outing to Kelsey Bass Lake this year for Saturday May 26 and Sunday May 27, 2007. I have four signups so far. I need twelve per day to reserve the whole lake.
